#### PROGRAM DIRECTOR'S REPORT

# Head Start/Early Head Start/NC Pre-K – Henderson, Polk & Transylvania Counties Linda Carter, Director of Children's Services, September 2021

Covid Updates: Ten classrooms shut down in the month due to Covid exposure. Eleven classrooms shutdown due to a lack of staff. The highest number to date of children (281) and staff (36) affected by Covid occurred in the month. Hiring continues to be a challenge and we are still 29 staff down, not counting the new sites, Forest City and Tebeau St., Hendersonville, to come on line. We lost a mom of one of our enrolled children at Bruce Drysdale to Covid during the month and one teacher (also, a mentor) for a Child Care Partner is hospitalized with Covid at this time, so please keep these families in your thoughts.

Facilities Update: Bids were received from Peacock Architects for the Tebeau property on August 30<sup>th</sup>, Tim Camp, Facilities & Safety Director and Elizabeth Whitten- CFO are determining next steps. Work quotes for the Forest City property were received 8/26 and higher than anticipated. Linda, Tim and Margit met with the architect and reworked the design. Two quotes have come in for the redesign and are pending thorough review and next steps or selection by Tim Camp. Sunny View EHS classrooms received licensing on Friday, September 10<sup>th</sup> and classrooms opened on the 13<sup>th</sup>. The four private pay slots for Polk County employees are filled at Sunny View. Attorneys are finalizing the purchase of the Thermal Belt Ministries' property for the future site of the Columbus Children's Center. WCCA received notification on 9/28 that we were award \$275,284 for the soft costs associated with the Columbus Children's Center building. Notification is still pending regarding the 1303 application for the total costs of the building project.

Head Start/NC Pre-k Update: As we have in years past, WCCA will continue to collaborate with HCPS on Kindergarten Transition meetings as part of a statewide Transition Pilot project. This falls directly under the HCPS READY! community collaboration transition initiative. This year, we will participate at all 6 pilot schools through WCCA Head Start teacher participation in school readiness planning (Upward Elementary, Sugarloaf Elementary, Mills River Elementary, Marlow Elementary, Fletcher Elementary, and Bruce Drysdale Elementary). Meetings are quarterly and focus on better transition plans and activities for both the children and families as well as bringing together Pre-K and Kindergarten professionals.

Interviewing continues for Head Start / NC Pre-K teaching staff, applications are slowly trickling in. DCDEE has allowed NC Pre-K staff flexibilities on lead teacher qualifications SFY 2021-2022. This has enabled WCCA to place Early Childhood Associate degree teachers in lieu of licensed Bachelor degree teachers in the NC Pre-K classroom. All other professional development requirements remain the same.

DCDE has released the North Carolina Pre-Kindergarten (NC Pre-K) Program Requirements and Guidance Effective SFY 2021-2022. This includes information on program implementation, budgets and monitoring. WCCA Site Supervisors will begin their monitoring in October, with a validation-monitoring visit during December-January. All verified monitoring tools will be submitted to the state by January 31, 2022.

Family Services Updates: Meghan Arnold, Data & Compliance Manager, has taken over the supervision of the ERSEA and Family Services Coordinators. Her new title is Compliance and Family Services

Manager. Our intent to hire a Family Services Manager did not yield a qualified candidate and Meghan's knowledge and experience in this area will make her a huge asset for both ERSEA and Family Services. Enrollment currently stands at 64% Enrollment for our Early Head Start/Head Start Grant with Early Head Start being at 60% enrollment and Head Start at 46%, including Dual Enrolled Children. In the Home Visiting Program, our overall enrollment is at 63%, with our HS Home Based being at 55% and our EHS Home Based being at 65%. We are at 67% enrollment for CCP and 6% for the EHS Expansion Grant. We have a Waitlist of 127 children, of which, 82 (65%) are Over Income. The 45 eligible children not enrolled is due to either all required paperwork has been received from the families for them to attend or classrooms do not have adequate, qualified teaching staff to open.

*Program Support Services:* COVID-19 continues to be a factor in our programming this year. We have had more exclusions of children and classroom closures this month than any other time during the pandemic. This is due to the Delta variant and a change from the state on who needs to be excluded. We are working diligently to ensure all children and staff are healthy and safe in the classrooms while maintaining positive relationships with our families.

When classrooms are open, Coaches and Early Intervention team have been active in all the classrooms supporting the teachers in implementation of curriculum while also getting to know children and families. We expected to see more needs in classrooms as staff's well-being is tenuous and children are returning from time away from structured environments. Trauma of an ongoing pandemic is affecting all of our staff, families, and children.

We implemented our first two afternoon trainings for staff. September 15<sup>th</sup> the focus was on completing home visits, staff meetings, fire & safety training and completing paperwork for enrollment. September 29th we completed training on Head Start History, The Head Start Program Performance Standards, and Active Supervision.

EHS & Childcare Partnership Updates: Our CCP sites are really struggling with multiple COVID cases in staff members right now. Kids Kingdom is closed through October 4, and Little Blessings will re-open on October 1, after being closed for the past two weeks in one of their EHS rooms. Staffing continues to be a challenge as sites try to maintain the appropriate ratios for EHS in their rooms.

Similarly, in our EHS classrooms at WCCA, our teachers, supervisors and other staff have demonstrated incredible flexibility and resilience. They arrive (when they are well!) each morning wondering which classrooms will be able to stay open and to do their best.

Overall, we are working to keep the children, families and staff as healthy as possible through a clean environment, policies, and procedures that protect them. Kristy Johnson, EHS & CCP Coordinator will be stepping back from her role to take time for her family and father. A hire offer has been extended for Kristy's replacement and this person will be introduced once everything is official.

Other Highlights: WCCA Children's services Focus Area 2 groups are meeting to prepare for the review which will be sometime in early 2022. The FA2 focuses on six areas: Program Management and Quality Improvement, Education and Child Development Services, Health Program Services, Family and Community Engagement Services, Fiscal Infrastructure, and ERSEA. Children's services site supervisors and Operations manager are accompanying the Facilities team on the CS facility's work through for an initial FA2 baseline. We look forward to training staff, Policy Council, and the Board in the next several

months on the FA2 review. Four members of the CS management team (Margit, Rachel, Amy P, and Meghan) attended the OHS Data Boot Camp in September to help prepare for WCCA's Focus Area 2 data tours. Linda attended the ChildPlus Scramble to gain more knowledge on the database used for all of Children's Services. Children's Services have added more lines of communication for staff and families to ensure we are meeting all of our HS/EHS family's needs through these challenging times as we seek to hire more staff. We established two Family Advocate helpline numbers for parents to call or text for referrals, assistance, support, or have someone call them to talk. Parents can always ask for help on-site, but some parents may feel more comfortable calling a helpline. Sugar Hill and three CCP sites (Little Red, Love and Learning, and Laurie's Childcare) will have the helplines. In addition to a monthly newsletter, Children's Services has started a weekly virtual communications meeting called the "Huddle"! All Children's Services staff are invited to the Huddle to hear the latest updates, ask questions, express any needs or concerns and celebrate our team's success. In these challenging times, pulling the team together to Huddle seems like a great communications move. The first Huddle was on September 27, and the staff responses indicated that we scored a touchdown! The second edition of the Children's Services newsletter went out on October 1st. Another means to have open communications for all Children's Services staff. If you are not on the email list and would like to receive the monthly newsletter please email lincarter@wcca.org to be added. After much careful review, the Children's Services **teaching staff received wage adjustments** to bring their rate of pay more in line with the Wage Compensation study and to be more competitive in the current hiring environment.

WCCA/Apple Country Transportation did receive a closure letter from NCDOT with no deficiencies from the 2019 Proficiency Review. This is another type of review required for transportation agencies that is normally a three-month process. The SSP review and the Proficiency Review are confirmation that the Transportation Department is in good standing with FTA and NCDOT compliance regulations.

# Information Systems Departmental – Henderson, Polk & Transylvania Counties Jonathan Stanley, Information Systems Director August 2021

The Information Systems Department team, made up of Director, Jonathan Stanley and Support Specialist, Cody Miller worked on a number of projects within WCCA.

The Information Technology team spent the majority of the last month providing in person and remote support to staff. Highlights from the last month include:

- New high speed internet installed at the Bargain Hendo thrift store. This will provide a better experience for on-site staff, remote security video monitoring and potential for a public hotspot.
- All Henderson County Public School sites now have dedicated internet connections in their respective classrooms that are exempted from the content filtering systems that blocked access to many of the services that our teachers need.
- Sunny View center in Polk County has a dedicated, unfiltered internet service provided through the elementary school. Many thanks to helpful and accommodating staff at Polk County Public Schools for making this possible.
- Many updates have been added to the agency website, including a new public events calendar.

# Facilities & Safety Department Report Tim Camp, Director

This month our maintenance team has been hard at work ensuring our facilities are ready for the FA2 review. They have completed multiple repairs in this area while also completing their normal weekly work orders. This has been especially difficult this month due to the high number of COVID cases that resulted in a greatly reduced capacity for one full week.

# **Maintenance Highlights:**

# • HVAC units at 7th Ave Apple Country:

The unit in question stopped cooling. Horizon Heating & Air performed an inspection/diagnosis of the unit and advised there was a hole in the compressor causing a refrigerant leak. The units at 7th Ave were 17 yrs old, manufactured in 2004. The refrigerant they use (R-22) is no longer manufactured and if found, costs approximately \$100.00 per pound. Due to age and the discontinuation of R-22 refrigerant the decision was made to replace the two units currently being used. Replacing both at the same time results in near-future savings in crane rental. This project has been completed.

#### • HVAC unit at Hillview Children's Center:

A unit at Hillview Center also stopped cooling. Horizon Heating & Air performed an inspection/diagnosis of the unit and advised the unit was leaking refrigerant. The unit was 16 yrs old and parts are no longer available. The decision was made to replace the unit. This project has been completed.

#### **Safety Highlights:**

- Performed a school walk-through with Principal Allen at Sunny View Elementary School and reviewed all current Emergency Preparedness and Response Plans
- Completed 12 Safety & Security Assessments; documented preventive maintenance and safety needs and next steps for safety trainings
- Completed preliminary safety planning meetings with Henderson County School District
