Facilities & Safety Department Report Tim Camp, Director December 2021

Maintenance Highlights:

- **Forest City Children's Center:** Construction has started on the new Forest City Children's Center. The first phase of demolition is well underway. The contractor is experiencing supply issues but we hope the project will stay on time.
- **Etowah Children's Center: Replaced** all the hand railing on the crib evacuation ramp.

Safety Highlights:

With the help of local law enforcement and the extra security we have installed, Tebeau Children's Center has not been broken into again. Our insurance claim was accepted and repairs will be made during renovations.

Most radon testing is completed (we have a few locations to go).

We completed a productive meeting with the interim fire marshall. He and his team are reviewing our office building emergency evacuation guidelines and will offer additional guidance if needed. We will be meeting again in early January at King Creek Main to review our emergency staging areas and designated meeting assembly area. This collaboration increases the safety of all employees as the local fire department will be familiar with our guidelines and locations. The fire marshall has offered a free "mock fire drill" and live fire extinguisher training which will also serve as an opportunity to provide them with experience in our building.

We extended our onboarding safety training to a full hour. This allows us to cover more detailed information along with new information about trips, slips and falls.

During a safety walkthrough at Tiger Town Thrift Store we noted an additional smoke detector was needed. This task has been completed.
