Report:

In the month of April as the weather has warmed, we have seen an increase in ridership and transportation request. We are very fortunate to be fully staffed and have been busy training our new drivers. The staff we have added are not only good drivers they are good people who want to serve the community. Two highlights from this month were attending the North Carolina Public Transportation annual conference and providing transportation for Blue Ridge Honor Flight. The conference was two and a half days of continuing transportation education along with the opportunity to meet other Transportation Director's and transportation officials from NCDOT. On Saturday April 23, six drivers and two staff members from WNCSource Transportation assisted Blue Ridge Honor Flight in providing transportation for veterans, assistants, family members and the public to and from the Asheville Regional Airport to designated parking lots. It was truly an honor and privilege to be a part of this endeavor. Finally, the TAB steering committee, working with a consultant has made significant progress on the TAB Strategic Plan. The first draft of the plan will be presented to the TAB at the May 19th meeting. Two additional planning session have been planned for 5/24 and early June to complete this work.

Information Systems Departmental – Henderson, Polk & Transylvania Counties Jonathan Stanley, Information Systems Director April 2022

The Information Systems Department team, made up of Director, Jonathan Stanley and Support Specialist, Cody Miller worked on a number of projects within WNCSource.

The Information Technology team spent the majority of the previous month providing in person and remote support to staff. Highlights from the last month include:

- We have decommissioned the temperature scanning kiosk and COVID-19 daily check-in form for the King Creek admin building considering the new policies.
- The IT department is working with Facilities Director Tim Camp to streamline billing approval and account management for all sites' telecommunications services. We have also been attempting to cut back where possible to reduce telecommunication costs.
- The Forest City Children's Center has been wired for cameras and internet service. We hope to have internet service connected in the next 30 days.

The WNCSource Information Systems department provides support to all staff and we maintain the following equipment:

Facilities & Safety Department Report Tim Camp, Director April 2022

Maintenance Highlights:

Our maintenance team is in full force working on landscaping across the four counties we represent. This includes winter clean up, the removal of fallen limbs, replacement of mulch where needed, grass cutting, cleaning gutters, and the trimming of bushes and trees. The team has also been working on playgrounds to remove old sand boxes and to clean up other items no longer used by our students.

• Tebeau Children's Center:

Concrete has been poured in all areas inside the building that had to be cut and removed due to the installation of new plumbing. Footings for the two new additions have been dug, approved, and now poured with concrete. The new slab has been poured in the front building that had to be removed due to floor conditions.

• Forest City Children's Center:

New fencing and shade structures are ordered for the Forest City Children's center.

• Bargain Hendo:

The outside handrails at Bargain Hendo Thrift Store were sanded down and painted.

• King Creek Children's Center:

The team has patched and painted multiple holes and cracks in the walls.

• Tiger Town Thrift Store:

A new WNCSource sign is being installed.

Safety Highlights:

We conducted safety checks at Tiger Town Thrift Store, Etowah Children's Center, and Quebec Community Center.

We replaced two fire extinguishers at N. Justice St, due to the annual inspection date.

A new safety handrail was installed at the top of the stairs at Tiger Town.

Four light posts in the lower parking lot were repaired at King Creek Main.
