Report:

Much work was completed in the month of May on the TAB strategic plan and work on this plan will continue in June. Work on the plan includes outlining strategies, outcomes, and ways to measure expected outcomes including timelines. The TAB also held its second quarter meeting on Thursday, May 19th and members were introduced to the draft strategic plan. New Transit Director training begins this month and I will be participating in this training that will run through the month of June. WNCSource Transportation has provided AM & PM transportation for the April and May Blue Ridge Honor Flights. In May, we had three drivers and two staff members present in the AM. In the PM, we had six drivers and two staff members present and transported just over 1000 people according to event officials. Lastly, and on schedule, ridership for all programs has increased due to our warmer weather. Our new hires are doing and excellent job with a focus on safety, customer service and seem to really like working for WNCSource!

Information Systems Departmental – Henderson, Polk & Transylvania Counties Jonathan Stanley, Information Systems Director May 2022

The Information Systems Department team, made up of Director, Jonathan Stanley and Support Specialist, Cody Miller worked on a number of projects within WNCSource.

The Information Technology team spent the majority of the previous month providing in person and remote support to staff. Highlights from the last month include:

- Tableau Children's Center has been wired for network devices and cameras. An estimated 38 cameras will be installed covering the majority of the property and building interior.
- We ported all phone numbers at Transylvania County locations to Ringfree (minus those used for security/fire detection systems) from Comporium. This will reduce costs for phone service at those sites significantly.
- We have streamlined our Adobe software subscriptions to reduce costs and provide better software tools to staff.
- Completed in internal IT security audit for a cyber security insurance application. Our Security Scorecard score is currently 98 out of 100.

The WNCSource Information Systems department provides support to all staff and we maintain the following equipment:

Facilities & Safety Department Report Tim Camp, Director May 2022

Maintenance Highlights:

Our maintenance team continues work on landscaping across the four counties we represent. This includes assembling outdoor equipment for the playgrounds, replacement of mulch where needed, grass cutting, cleaning gutters, and the trimming of bushes and trees. The team continues to update playgrounds to remove old sand boxes and to clean up other items no longer used by our students.

• Tebeau Children's Center:

The construction continues at Tebeau Children's Center. The framing for the two new additions on the front building has begun. New, usable windows have been installed in the front building which will allow fresh air into the classrooms. Multiple doors on the front building have been removed, framed, and new windows installed. The contractor has begun work installing cable throughout the two buildings to be used for our security cameras.

• Forest City Children's Center:

This site passed final inspection with minor repairs. The floors will be waxed and the facilities team will also begin working on the playgrounds next week.

• North Justice St:

The hallways have been updated with new paint.

• Flat Rock Children's Center:

At our Flat Rock Children's Center we received a request to inspect the classrooms for any possible safety concerns after spots on the back of a rug were found. Finding no health and safety concerts, we did remove two items from the room (a broken chair and the rug in question). All floors were cleaned, a COVID disinfectant treatment was applied, and an air quality test was performed. The test results reported no health and safety issues.

Safety Highlights:

- The new fire system at Forest City has passed inspection.
- We conducted safety checks at 7th Ave.
- We are working with all areas of WNCSource to reduce slips, trips, and falls.
