# Living Wage Certification for WNCSource and Local Labor Market Data

Just Economics, a nonprofit whose tagline is *creating sustainable livelihoods* has certified WNCSource as a living wage employer for 2022-2023. WNCSource has been a certified living wage employer since 2009. This is an accomplishment we are proud of, and shows our commitment to equity and economic justice. Currently, this certification may not be enough in an increasingly competitive labor market.

In preparing for our Head Start grant change of scope we conducted a local wage comparability study. Gina Dowd, Children's Services Volunteer and Recruitment Coordinator and Margit Nelson, Children's Services Operations and Procurement Manager conducted an extensive survey of local employers in several industries that compete with WNCSource for employees. They were able to gather starting wage information from over one hundreds and fifty employers in Western North Carolina. When compared across several industries that we compete with for staff, WNCSource is below average in the compensation we offer for starting positions. Please see graphs below. Also, the data indicates that more employers offer good benefit packages than we thought. All of the data supports a need for our change of scope application with The Office of Head Start.
