Report:

July 2022 has been another great month in transportation. We have finalized the TAB strategic plan and will present the draft plan to the TAB for approval during the August 18th meeting. Kudos to David White and Noah Rose for their involvement in the planning process. The department is fully staffed and are working hard to provided as many trips a day as we can provide in a safe and reliable manner. Two transit policies have been drafted and presented to the County for their approval. One policy addresses the proper protocols for transit bathroom breaks. This can be very challenging for our drivers as they currently do not have a place or time built into their bus schedule for these types of breaks. The transportation department, working with a consultant and former transit director, drafted a safe and reliable plan for our drivers. We also drafted a transit rider suspension policy with the help of the same consultant. We believe these plans will serve us well as we enter into the new transit service contract.

In July, we continued our driver training with wheelchair securement and safety. This training was divided into two session and all Transportation employees participated in this training. With new transportation operation systems in place and a great staff we look forward to serving the citizens of our community during the month of August.

Information Systems Departmental – Henderson, Polk & Transylvania Counties Jonathan Stanley, Information Systems Director July 2022

The Information Systems Department team, made up of Director, Jonathan Stanley and Support Specialist, Cody Miller worked on a number of projects within WNCSource.

The Information Technology team spent the majority of the previous month providing in person and remote support to staff. Highlights from the last month include:

- We completed the infrastructure wiring project at Tebeau street. We only need to connect our equipment and mount cameras and Wi-Fi access points.
- Cameras have been mounted at Forest City site and internet service has just been installed.
 Equipment will be activated the 1st week of August which will conclude the project at that site.

The WNCSource Information Systems department provides support to all staff and we maintain the following equipment:

Maintenance Highlights:

Our maintenance team continues work on landscaping across the four counties we represent. This includes assembling outdoor equipment for the playgrounds, replacement of mulch where needed, grass cutting, cleaning gutters, and the trimming of bushes and trees. The team continues to update playgrounds and prepare for the FA2.

• Tebeau Children's Center:

The construction continues at Tebeau Children's Center. New sheetrock has been installed; the finish work has been completed and painted. Framing for the drop ceiling in the back building has been completed. New inside doors have been installed. The contractors are completing the installation of the cable throughout the two buildings to be used for our security cameras, security alarms, badge readers and fire alarm.

• Forest City Children's Center:

The construction on the Forest City Children's Center has been completed. The facilities team will continue to assist children's services as needed.

Safety Highlights:

We conducted safety checks and building inspections at the King Creek Main office, King Creek Children's Center, Sunny View Elementary, Hillview Children's Center, Tiger Town Thrift Store, and Kids Kingdom.

We are working with all areas of WNCSource to reduce slips, trips, and falls. We have removed furniture, recommended new placement of furniture and classroom supplies, and removed unnecessary barriers to prevent falls.

We supply Prevent Heat Illness at Work information to our maintenance team.
