## **Highlights**

King Creek-EHS Teacher – Delores Davis recognized as WNCSource's 2022 Employee of the Year at the 12/20 Luncheon .

WNCSource hosted the Rutherford County CANDL event on 12/8/2022 and had an incredible community turnout. Parents, providers, and community members all came to share their ideas, opinions, and needs on childcare in the county. We were able to collect valuable data to help support Early Childhood advocacy.

The wage increases made possible through the approved Changes in Scope were individually communicated to teaching staff before the Holiday break. Increases ranged from 2% to 25%, depending on education levels and time with the agency. The increases were made xeffective 1/1/2023.

Toured a recently built Southeastern Community Action Partnership Head Start Center in Maxton, NC on 12/15. We saw some good ideas and suggestions for future WNCSource centers.




Average Daily Attendance by Program Type

   COVID Related absences increased by 1.5%)


#### Absence Reasons



#### 120 coaching contacts

We have initiated 7 referrals. They are in process. We have others with support plans that may lead to a referral.


As we complete ASQs more referrals maybe made.

## **Development & Behavior Screenings**



We have completed 286 ASQ-3 and ASQ: SE -2 and are continuing to complete scheduled ASQs with families.

We are scheduling new enrollees as soon as possible. All currently enrolled children either have the screening completed or are in process of being scheduled. The drop in the percentage in Expansion is due to Forest City opening. We will do those ASQs at their Open House on January 4.



One of the Health team's biggest goals is to address the issue of children not having access to dental care

- Improve communication with FA's and site staff
- Documentation, reminders, and more active monitoring of children needing access
- Working with local resources
- Flat Rock has new classroom and new families that we are waiting to hear back from

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### **Nutrition Program**

- CACFP Audits
  - Wrapped up the first of 3 internal audits for CACFP compliance
  - Monitored each active site for October operations
    - Discovered grain based desserts being served for breakfast at 3 locations
      - Grain based desserts are high in sugar and not reimbursable by CACFP
      - WNCSource owes back all reimbursements breakfasts that were served with Grain based desserts.
      - Addressed with sites and HCPS that we cannot serve items
    - Other questionable menu items that are high in sugar but still reimbursable
      - For ex: Banana bread has 24g sugar per packaged item. Adults are recommended to consume no more than 35 g/d. It is recommended that children limit sugar intake in general

## **Nutrition Program Continued**

- CACFP Audit with state representative will take place January 9th-13th
  - Audit will focus on the month of October
    - Bruce Drysdale and Hillandale audit sites
    - Both did well during our own site visit monitoring
  - Main agenda will be to check financial reports vs reported meals served to assess integrity of program

  - Letter Sort video, '[child] had a little hard time but was enthusiastic!'
  - Welcome to ReadyRosie video, 'I'm excited to do these activities with my daughter! Thank you!'

## **Head Start / NC Pre-K & Updates**

- NC Pre-K annual monitoring continues for all sites. This tool was completed in the late Fall by each Site Administrator. It is designed to provide a checklist of those components of the program that must be reviewed for compliance annually including, curriculum implementation, family engagement, health & developmental assessments, administrator credentials and teacher licenses. The Site Monitoring Tool must be verified by January 31st and a copy will be maintained on file at each facility, along with supporting documentation, for review by the DCDEE NC Pre-K Program Policy Consultant.
- January brings a mindset of re-focusing on teacher professional development. The
  Children's Services Management team, along with program Coordinators have come
  together to plan the remaining 2022-23 program year. Upcoming learning opportunities
  include: Multicultural / Planned Language Approach / Inclusion training, Conscious
  Discipline training, and exploring "Communities of Practice" (understanding curriculum
  data and aggregating that data for growth).
