


Average Daily Attendance by Program Type

- 3.1% of those absences are related to COVID and a majority absences are due to Parent Decision. COVID Related absences decreased by 1.0%)





Coaching Updates

256 coaching contacts

- 24 Intensive coaching included follow-up onboarding for 3 preschool teachers and 3 days initial onboarding for 1 EHS teacher
- 24 Standard coaching
- 4 self coaching

Curriculum Fidelity checklists have been completed for 8 EHS classrooms. Fidelity results will be shared next month after the remaining classrooms have been completed.

An abbreviated QCIT observation, just focusing on social-emotional support, has been completed for 9 EHS classrooms. Most classrooms had an average score of 5 or higher with the range of scoring being a 1-7 scale. This observation focused on response to social cues, response to emotional cues, building a positive relationship, and supporting peer interaction. Problem-solving, responsive routines, classroom limits, a sense of belonging, and response to distress were also rated.

We have initiated 11 referrals. We have 2 others in process and 8 Child Support Plans that may lead to a referral.


As we complete ASQs more referrals maybe made.

Development & Behavior Screenings




We have completed 289 ASQ-3 and ASQ: SE -2 and are continuing to complete scheduled ASQs with families.

We are scheduling new enrollees as soon as possible. All currently enrolled children either have the screening completed or are in process of being scheduled.

Vision and Hearing Referral Status

 - 10- have future appointments with specialists or we are waiting for results from specialist appointment
 - 1- possibly needing follow up specialty care
 - 1- Pediatrician wants to wait until Kindergarten to refer
 - 1- Unknown results from specialist visit
 - 1 failed hearing referred to primary care 01/24/23
 - o 2 children are in their 45 day time period and need screenings completed


Nutrition Program

Partnership (CCP), EHS, and FCCH Updates

Due to the recent Change of Scope, WNCSource is able to provide a higher per child tuition rate for the CCP sites. This increase will allow CCP directors to raise teacher pay to potentially help stabilize their staff with retention and new hires.

CCP team meetings were held on 1/6, 1/13, and 1/27. The CCP Director meeting was held 1/26. The CCP Director meeting has a slightly changed format and structure to primarily provide program updates to the CCP sites, and also more in-depth training on a different policy and procedure each month.

Partnership and FCCH recruitment efforts continue. Potential Henderson County resident is still very interested in partnering with WNCSource. They are in the process of meeting licensing conditions to hopefully open as a partnership site as soon as possible.

Head Start / NC Pre-K Program Updates





- February brings a re-focus on Outdoor Learning Environments with Gardening. Over the past few months we have received several "Farm-2-Preschool" related grants from multiple organization across Western NC total close to \$10,000. We are now working on developing plans for gardening and healthy eating materials & equipment for our sites. Considerations will include impact on the existing outdoor/indoor environments, health and sanitation and utilizing community partners. Our WNCSource Health & Nutrition Coordinator, Dylan Allanson is working on a survey for teachers to gain insight on their needs and "buy-in" into this initiative.
- Tebeau Children's Center continues to progress towards opening for EHS, HS & NCPRK children! Building/Zoning, Fire Inspections complete. Next steps include Sanitation and licensing visits.
- 2023 "Kindergarten Rallies" begin for both Henderson County (March-April at each Elementary location) and Transylvania County for the entire community on April 6th. HS/NCPK staff will participate at various locations promoting WNCSource Head Start services.
