### Facilities & Safety Department Report Tim Camp, Director March 2023

#### **Maintenance Highlights:**

#### **Columbus Children's Center (New):**

The site work plans have been completed by Odom Engineering. The civil work (grading, plumbing, sewer, sidewalks, etc.) have been bid and awarded. A contract is underway and we expect it to be completed soon. The architect team, including the structural and electrical engineers, have completed the plans. The bid will be published in early April. Odom Engineering has marked the new locations of the new sewer lines that we were required to move. The city contractor has been informed of the marking of the new locations. The contractor has ordered materials and will be installing the new sewer lines.

#### **Tebeau Children's Center:**

Our new shade structures have been installed at our Tebeau Children's Center. We are working with Children's Services and the vendor to install the remainder of the playground equipment.

#### King Creek & Etowah Children's Center:

Our maintenance team has been making sheetrock repairs, replacements, and painting in multiple locations around the buildings as needed.

#### **Safety Highlights:**

Our safety team continues to focus on reducing trips, slips and falls. We have completed additional walk-throughs at all WNCSource locations. As a result, we noted and addressed new concerns:

- We have floated the sidewalk to reduce the tripping hazard at King Creek. We know this is a temporary fix and we will address it again in the future.
- Walkways at Hillview and Etowah have been pressure washed to eliminate slick surfaces.
- Slip resistant paint has been added to the side ramp at Etowah, the entrance ramp at Bruce Drysdale, and will be added to the ramps at Hillview.
- Loose stair rails at Tiger Town have been replaced and repaired.

During this month's Safety Committee meeting, we presented the "Fatigue at Work and on the Road can be Deadly" training. This included causes and consequences of employee fatigue.
