



- 0.6% of those absences are related to COVID and a majority absences are due to Illness/Injury.


#### Absence Reasons

In addition to coaching, the coaches have also been involved with the CLASS video pilot so have been videoing some of the Head Start/NC Pre-K classrooms. I completed in-person CLASS observations for the two HS/NC Pre-K classrooms that were not included in the video pilot. I also am beginning to resume QCIT observations for our EHS classrooms.

Initial intensive onboarding was also provided to two new EHS teachers and two new HS teachers.

### **Early Head Start Updates**

There has been an increase in Early Head Start applicants with several new-hires during April. This is enabling our newest Tebeau location to begin serving children on May 15th! Interviewing actively continues for all open teaching positions.

The WNCSource coaching team has been spending lots of time in our EHS classrooms, helping staff and children grow. Several EHS classrooms have been redesigned to include parent greeting and departure areas with comfy chairs for special parent-child moments! Thank you Coaches and EHS staff!

Our Forest City Children's Center has a new site supervisor! Debbie is in our site supervisor training program and looking forward to joining the Forest City Team.

We have hired two new EHS Teachers in our Flat Rock Children's Center so we are looking forward to opening an additional EHS toddler classroom for children in the new school year August-September 2023. We can't wait to welcome new families into our facilities.

We have a Teacher Trainee, Tiffany Williams, who has successfully completed her first classes and applied for an EHS Teaching position with our Forest City Site. We look forward to Tiffany joining the EHS Team!

Our EHS toddler classroom at King Creek will be welcoming a returning EHS teacher (within the next month) Sunshine Atkins into our classroom. We are excited to have Sunshine back!

### **Head Start / NC Pre-K Program Updates**

- We are pleased to welcome a new Head Start Area Manager (Heather Brewer-Jones)
  to the team. She returns to us (in-person) from working remotely during the
  pandemic. Her "area" includes King Creek, our four Henderson County (HCPS)
  HS/NCPK classroom and our newest facility, Tebeau Children's Center.
- NC Division of Child Development & Early Education (DCDEE) Child Care licensing visits continue to occur at our facilities throughout the Spring. Our centers remain prepared for these State required visits with monthly comprehensive "internal monitoring" conducted by individual Site Supervisors and Area Managers.
- Head Start and NC Pre-K classrooms continue preparation for the anticipated transition to "Big School" in the fall. Exciting events are taking place across our service counties that include "field trips" to local elementary schools and more!





#### Little Red School - Four of 16 EHS Spots Filled. Needs to hire three teachers.

- Room LR1: Temporarily closed due to lack of staff. Four EHS spots available when reopened. Needs to hire two teachers.
- Room LR2: Six of eight EHS spots filled.
   One permanent teacher, one long-term substitute. Needs to hire one permanent teacher.

## Little Blessings: Sixteen of 20 EHS Spots Filled. Six teachers on staff, needs to hire four teachers.

- Room: Waddlers: Eight of eight EHS spots filled
- Room Toddlers: 1 Eight of eight spots filled (Four spots filled are expansion grant)
- Room Toddlers 2: Room temporarily closed due to lack of staff.

## Laurie's Child Care - Five of Five EHS Spots Filled. Fully staffed.

Five of five (FCCH) EHS spots filled. One teacher

## Kids' Kingdom - Eleven of 21 EHS Spots Filled. Fully staffed.

- Infants/Ones Room: Four of eight EHS spots filled. One spot open for returning teacher's infant, and three filled with subsidy. Staff: Two teachers.
- Toddler 1 Room: Four of eight EHS spots filled. Three are subsidy/private pay. One open EHS spot. Staff: Two teachers
- Toddler 2 Room: Three of eight EHS spots filled. Five spots are subsidy/private pay. Staff: Two teachers

#### Partnership (CCP), EHS, and FCCH Updates

We are in the final stages of opening a family child care home in Henderson County. Once all of the details and hurdles are addressed, we anticipate a smooth transition into a partnership.

A second new partnership is in the works with the Little Bright Minds Center on Chimney Rock Rd. in Hendersonville.

We are excited to announce we can provide retention and sign-on bonuses to the CCP sites!! This is a tremendous step to support our CCP partners to hire more staff and move towards full enrollment.
