### Facilities & Safety Department Report Tim Camp, Director June 2023

## Maintenance Highlights:

#### **Columbus Children's Center (New):**

The contractor has almost completed the installation of a new storm water system. Once complete they will start grading for the foundation of the new building and parking lots. During this process with the help of the geotechnical engineers, we will determine the status of the ground and if additional remediation is necessary. We are expecting this to be the case. I worked with Dunlap Construction Company to reduce construction costs, resulting in approximately \$114,000.00 in savings for the new center.

#### **Tebeau Children's Center:**

The installation of the new employee parking lot is almost complete. The new asphalt has been added and is currently curing. After curing, the project will be completed.

### King Creek Children's Center:

The installation of the playground equipment has been completed.

### Safety Highlights:

This month our safety team completed the SOP train-the-trainer course for the I Love You Guys Foundation. The I Love You Guys Foundation provides SOP's for common security language and strategies to be used in the event of an emergency. WNCSource has been using this system for over a year. Hendersonville County School District has now adopted the I Love You Guys system and allowed us to participate in one of their training sessions, enabling additional members of our team to be trained.

### Information Systems Departmental – Henderson, Polk & Transylvania Counties Jonathan Stanley, Information Systems Director May 2023

The Information Systems Department team, made up of Director, Jonathan Stanley and Support Specialist, Cody Miller worked on a number of projects within WNCSource.

The Information Technology team spent the majority of the previous month providing in person and remote support to staff. Highlights from the last month include:

- We have purchased 40 laptops and 40 iPads with money from a special grant to enhance classroom connectivity and productivity.
- We upgraded the switch infrastructure at the King Creek admin building using the same special grant funding. These new switches provide faster networking speeds. expanded capacity and the ability to connect newer IOT devices to our network.
- We have installed new networking and video recording hardware at the recently reopened Fletcher Children's Center.

The WNCSource Information Systems department provides support to all staff and we maintain the following equipment:
