Facilities & Safety Department Report Tim Camp, Director July 2023

Maintenance Highlights:

Our maintenance team continues work on landscaping across the four counties we represent. This includes assembling outdoor equipment for the playgrounds, replacement of mulch where needed, grass cutting, cleaning gutters, and the trimming of bushes and trees. The team continues to update playgrounds to remove old equipment and to clean up other items no longer used by our students.

Columbus Children's Center:

The contractor has completed excavating the area for the foundation of the new building. Next, the geotechnical engineers will review the work to ensure the depth and the status of the ground meet requirements, or if additional remediation is required. This step is necessary to ensure the ground will hold the weight of the building. Once reviewed for accuracy, they will supervise the installation of the rock and felt to ensure the work is completed correctly. Next, the contractor will start grading for the remainder of the lot, including parking lots.

Tebeau Children's Center:

The installation of the new employee parking lot has cured. New parking bumpers have been added. Once the new lot has been striped, the project will be completed.

Safety Highlights:

This month our safety team completed the SOP training for our staff at North Justice Street. We covered the standard response protocols and common security language for active shooter, natural disasters, fire, door management, etc. We covered responses at our office locations and school locations because they serve both locations and protocols are somewhat different. We also worked with staff to find a resolution with a threat made against a staff member.

Information Systems Departmental – Henderson, Polk & Transylvania Counties Jonathan Stanley, Information Systems Director May 2023

The Information Systems Department team, made up of Director, Jonathan Stanley and Support Specialist, Cody Miller worked on a number of projects within WNCSource.

The Information Technology team spent the majority of the previous month providing in person and remote support to staff. Highlights from the last month include:

- We have about deployed 25% of the 40 laptops and 40 iPads purchased with money from a special grant to enhance classroom connectivity and productivity.
- We had a security analysis completed that examined our corporate network to highlight any vulnerabilities that might exist. We also had penetration testing done in addition to the analysis. No severe vulnerabilities were discovered and those minor concerns, which were reported, are being addressed.

The WNCSource Information Systems department provides support to all staff and we maintain the following equipment:
