# Tebeau Children's Center:

A new walking path has been added from the employee parking lot to the adjacent sidewalk. This will enable parents and staff to avoid walking through mud and grass. New storage cabinets have been added in specific classrooms as needed.

# Forest City Children's Center:

As a proactive safety measure, our maintenance team constructed and installed fencing around the entrance doors of the school. The entrance to this school is close to the road and this provides an added safety barrier as parents bring children into and out of the building.

### Hillview Children's Center:

We have completed the necessary repairs to the damaged accessibility ramp located at the front entrance of the building.

# Columbus Children's Center (New Center):

The building contractor has completed the install of rebar, stone, poly, and wire mesh, and has completed the termite treatment. The below grade electrical is complete and has passed the state inspection. The slab and footers have been poured and completed and have been reviewed and approved by the geotechnical engineers. Temporary power has been installed, and the walls have been erected.

The Information Systems Department team, made up of Director, Jonathan Stanley and Support Specialist, Cody Miller worked on a number of projects within WNCSource.

The Information Technology team spent the majority of the previous month providing in person and remote support to staff. Highlights from the last month include:

- We expanded Wi-Fi coverage to outdoor playgrounds and the parking lot at Tebeau
- We expanded Wi-Fi coverage at Sugar Hill to cover one end of the facility which was suffering from poor reception.
- We made additions to the website including a new page for "News, Events and Press Releases" postings.
- We have migrated electronic signature platform providers from Docusign to Adobe Sign, reducing cost in the process.
- We have set up a reputation management system with help from Terri Bowman and the Goss Agency to help our online presence through sites such as Google Places, Bing, Yelp, Facebook and others.
