- Implement the next phase of the Trauma Resilient Communities project
- Meet recruitment and retention goals for full staffing
- Meet recruitment goals for children in Head Start, Early Head Start, Developmental Daycare, and Wrap-Around services
- Open our new Early Head Start facility in Polk County
- Continue to grow our Older Adult Services in Transylvania County
- Continue to grow our Nonemergency Medical Transportation programs
- Invest in our affordable housing units in Transylvania County
- Increase Board engagement through more in-person meeting opportunities
