Highlights

The Support Services Staff and CCP team are preparing for a day of Creative curriculum training **on February 2**, **2024**.

We are excited to welcome our two new CCP partners, Pisgah Forest, Klds City, USA, and Rosman, Klds City, USA. Both sites will be serving 16 EHS children and families.

The WNCsource Dental Campaign was a huge success, and Flat Rock Children's Center ensured that 100% of their families had a dental home. Congratulations to the Flat Rock Children's Center Team and the Health Team.

The last Helping Hand/WNCSource Transition team meeting was held 1/25. One Developmental Day (DD) classroom will open 2/5/2025 at the Tebeau Children's Center with 18 children. Interviews for a second DD Teacher are continuing to take place until a qualified candidate can be hired. 1 Lead Teacher and 4 Teacher Assistants applied and were hired from Helping Hand.

Classroom Closures

January 1 - 26

Unscheduled:

2 classrooms at King Creek closed on Wednesday, January 3rd due to heating issues.

All classrooms were closed on Tuesday, January 9th due to inclement weather.

All Forest City classrooms were also closed on January 10th & 11th due to inclement weather.

Etowah was closed from Wednesday, January 10th through Friday, January 19th due to flooding. The classrooms moved temporarily to Hillview until they reopened at Etowah on Monday, January, 22nd.







Early Intervention Updates

19 Children are currently receiving private therapy throughout our agency.

Our Classroom Specialist Nathalie Steffan Santos is supporting a classroom at Sugar Hill and provided training and support to Hillandale last month as well.

The EI team is fully staffed our new developmental specialist, Ale Carro, started.

Our EIBSs have started to support classrooms using a pilot program of Al's Pal's from TS as well as other lessons to teach social/emotional skills.

Head Start / NCPK Teacher Focus on a Holistic Approach of Development while Working with Families:

• During both informal / formal interactions with families in the classroom, teachers are demonstrating and encouraging families to discover what "hands-on play" means. Families are learning that children can develop their motor and cognitive abilities as well as their social skills through everyday play opportunities. Holistic development occurs when families are encourage to get creative with their children in everyday situations like going to the store, being outdoors, pretend play in the car, social experiences with other children and even using everyday household items for "play".

HS/NCPK Classroom Highlights

WNCSource Bruce Drysdale Children's Center:

During their clothing study in January the class enjoyed a story called *Something from Nothing*. It was about a grandpa who sews a blanket for his grandson and repurposes the fabric all the way to a button as the grandson grows. This intrigued the class, so they began exploring buttons & sewing.

In this picture, when a child was expressing frustration with the buttons, her friend offered to show/help her. This type of play matters because it is a catalyst for children to develop leadership skills as they interact with their peers and solve problems together.







Our new Edneyville classroom opened on 1/16/24 with seven children in attendance. More Children are being enrolled each week to eventually reach our capacity of 18. They had a wonderful first day, focused fun activities encouraging relationship building with teachers and their peers. The group is looking forward to learning and growing together as a school family!

We now have seven partners in the CCP program. Four in Henderson county, two in Transylvania county, and one in Rutherford county.

We are looking forward to a Creative Curriculum training with a focus on intentional lesson planning. This full-day training will take place on February 2nd for CCP directors and teachers.

Professional Development Updates

January 2nd All Staff PD: We had the opportunity to come together at Lutheridge for a full day of training to welcome us back after the holiday break. We heard from BEANS about financial wellness, and the free services they are offering to our staff. We also did a training on our organizations code of conduct and had a lot of great conversations during the breakout activity. We wrapped up the day with a Information session from The Center for Trauma Resilient Communities about the work they are doing to support us in becoming a trauma informed and resilient organization.

We currently have 4 staff working on their T.E.A.C.H applications and are hoping to get the approval from T.E.A.C.H soon!

We had two member from our ED team, Paige Bronson and Candy Doncevic, attend a week long training in Orlando FI, to obtain their QCIT Observer Credential!!



Trainee Program: Our new trainee Yamili Olvera has begun working on obtaining her IT CDA. She will spend the next 4 months working in two different EHS classrooms, learning, engaging with students and parents, working on her CDA portfolio, and will spend Wednesdays completing her 120hr education requirement through Quorum. Currently Yamili is assigned to Tebeau in Sharli and Angelica's EHS Classroom.

Apprenticeship Program: Apprentices started in their new classrooms on Jan 4th. All are currently placed in an EHS classroom where they will stay for the duration of this 16 week rotation. In May our apprentices will have completed the program and their classes and we are hopeful that they will apply for a permanent position with WNSource!!

Apprentice Program 24-25 at BRCC is currently accepting applications! New apprentices will be chosen later in the year and will begin in our program august 2024.
