THINK OF CULTURE AS GROWNG PLANTS. THERE ARE THREE MAIN COMPONENTS NECESSARY TO REAP THE BENEFITS OF DIVERSITY, EQUITY AND INCLUSION:

Prepping the "Soil": When introducing diversity of any kind to an environment, think of the newness as embarking upon new soil. If you are going to plant in an area that has not be cultivated before, the ground must be tilled.

Planting Seeds: A workplace culture of diversity, equity and inclusion must be intentional. Intentionality plants seeds in fertile soil and encourages others to share their perspectives, fosters ambitious ideas, and encourages understanding & acceptance.

Weeding: Inclusion means that all voices are heard and that all perspectives are honored, and that is driven by bringing people together. By default, that means that hateful language and practices must be "weeded" out.







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
