We have hired a full-time CDL driver for Transit, one full-time van driver and two intermittent van drivers. We are continuing to interview multiple candidates to fill CDL and non-CDL positions. We have added additional riders to our paratransit operations and updated some of our routes and schedules to increase efficiency. WNCSource supported the Blue Ridge Honor Flight event on April 27<sup>th</sup> by providing six shuttle vans to transport participating veterans and families. We had six drivers participate and two other staff members to assist with loading, unloading, and directing traffic.
