


Average Daily Attendance by Program



Development & Behavior Screenings

Mental Health

21 children received support during August for behavioral/mental health needs.

13 families have received mental health support in August from the EI team or our mental health consultant, Ashley Witt.

59 Behavior Incidents logged during August in 9 different classrooms.

Team is supporting 2 children with an initial Early Alert to determine any behavioral needs at this time.

Our mental health consultant visited 2 classrooms this month to conduct observations and provide feedback and support.


Forest City-
