Transportation Report – October 2024

We had no damage to any buses or vans from the storm. So far, we have had one car reported with water damage.

On Thursday, September 26th, all vans were able to complete the day. Apple Country ran routes 1 and 3 all day but we had to shut down route 2 midday because of flooding. We were not able to run Apple Country from Friday, the 27th through Friday, October 3rd due to the storm and CNG fueling issues. Before and after the storm using our high-top vans, we were able to help evacuate people, move people to and from shelters. Working with the hospital, we helped transport people in need of oxygen and medical runs, and we have been running emergency supplies. We are still working with emergency services moving some people and supplies. The country is using one of our vans as needed to move people.
